This poster sets out the 20 standard statements of the National Standards for infection prevention and control in community services and should be read in conjunction with the full Standards, available on the HIQA website, www.higa.ie.

Theme 1: Person-centred Care and Support

People are provided with appropriate information and are involved in Standard 1.1 decisions about their care to prevent, control and manage healthcare-associated infections and antimicrobial resistance.
